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## Woman Named First Education Secretary

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Carter today chose Shirley M. Hufstедler, the first woman federal appeals judge, to be the first secretary of the Department of Education.

Kreps and HEW Secretary Patricia Roberts Harris. The president, in his statement, said Mrs. Hufstедler "could take a new fresh look at the way we educate our children."

"I have intense concern about the quality of education for all Americans, particularly those in primary and secondary schools," she told the newspaper after her meeting with Carter. "But I don't have any specific ideas right now about the Department of Education because I simply don't know enough about the entire program."

Mrs. Hufstедler lives in Pasadena, Calif., with her husband, Seth M. Hufstедler, a prominent California attorney. She has one son, Steven. Observers of the federal judiciary consider her liberal to moderate in her judicial philosophy; she had been mentioned as a prime candidate to be the first woman on the U.S. Supreme Court.

In 1966, she was appointed to the California State Court of Appeals. She serves as a trustee of the California Institute of Technology, Occidental College and the Aspen Institute for Humanistic Studies.

## SERVE To Aid Handicapped Voters

Voting procedures which affect the visually impaired or disabled have been studied by the local SERVE organization (Serve, Enrichment and Rehabilitation for the Visually Exceptional) with the purpose of assisting at the Nov. 6 election.

Acceptable reasons for using the absentee ballot are absence from the county on election day; hospitalization on election day; accident or unforeseen medical emergency; personal illness or physical disability; in jail for a misdemeanor or awaiting trial; religious observance; being an election official; or being 62 years of age or older.

office at the time of application. Before either of the two methods for voting listed above can be used the voter must be registered. SERVE recommends checking to make sure of voter eligibility. If a person has not voted in the past two years, or has moved, he or she may not be registered.

As education secretary, Mrs. Hufstедler, a liberal-to-moderate California Democrat, would oversee a department with a \$14 billion budget and about 17,000 employees. The post pays \$69,630 a year.

The legislation creating the Cabinet-level Education Department was signed into law by Carter on Oct. 17, setting in motion the bureaucratic machinery that will establish the department. This will be the second Cabinet department established by Carter.

## Government Begins Changes After Death Of Korean President

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — Acting President Choi Kyu-hah named a new director of the Korean Central Intelligence Agency today in what was seen as the first major step to consolidate the government's position following the killing of President Park Chung-hee by the KCIA's former head.

appointment was an important move by Choi and the military leaders cooperating with him to take over the now-disorganized secret police organization, a mainstay of support for Park in suppressing dissent and political opposition during the late president's 18 years of autocratic rule.

is in disarray and is being ignored by Choi and the generals, the sources reported. The leading candidates for the presidency appear to be two former military men who were among those closest to Park and served him as prime minister: Kim Jong-pil and Chung Il-kwon. Kim was the chief organizer of the 1961 coup that put Park in power and the founder and first head of the Korean Central Intelligence Agency, while Chung has held a number of top army and political posts.

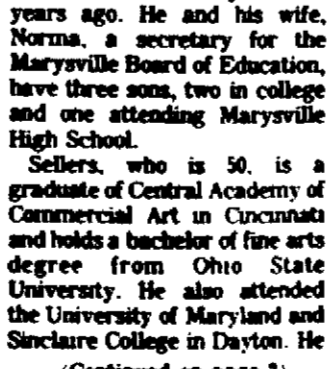
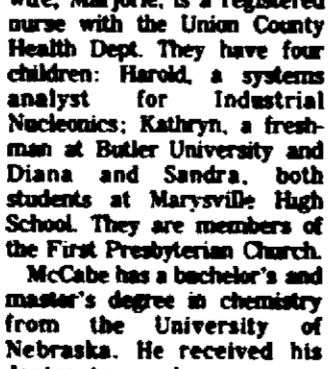
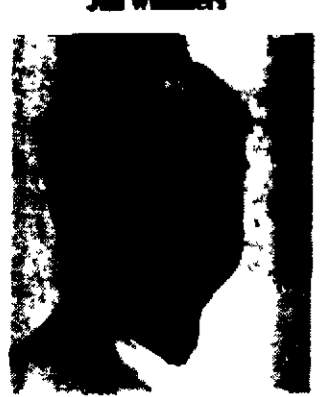

Seven candidates are seeking seats for the Marysville Board of Education.

Gary Cormany, 924 Catalpa Pl. is plant manager at Goodyear Tire and Rubber Co. and has lived in Marysville since 1975. He stated, "Good management on the part of the school board results in a good quality school system. I have been with Goodyear 17 years in many different management positions. I feel my background will be advantageous in serving on the board."

He said, "I believe that every child is entitled to a basic educational package. WASHINGTON (AP) — The battle is joined, the Kennedy mystique versus the power of an incumbent president. The prize: the 1980 Democratic presidential nomination.

On Nov. 7, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy will announce in Boston that he will challenge President Carter for the nomination. On Dec. 4, Carter will announce he wants a second term.

The Kennedy candidacy advanced Monday when his brother-in-law, Stephen Smith, standing in front of a large "KENNEDY '80" banner, announced formation of the Kennedy for President Committee. He said he hoped "all citizens in this nation who share our belief that Sen. Kennedy should be the next president of the United States will join in the campaign we are beginning today."

Smith said one reason Kennedy decided to run was that "he feels the real drift in this country and the sense of a lack of direction."

Kennedy has made it clear he will make opposition to administration energy and economic policies a major part of his campaign.
